On Wednesday, June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021, around 7:30 pm, on the 700 block of East 27<sup>th</sup> Street the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) attempted a controlled detonation after seizing a large cache of illegal fireworks from a home. After seizing the illegal fireworks, LAPD's bomb squad determined that it was best to dispose of the fireworks on-site because the materials were "very volatile". The attempt at a controlled detonation went horribly wrong and led to a powerful blast endangering residents within the community. According to several reports, the blast shook the neighborhood, overturning a nearby vehicle, shattering glass and damaging homes. Additionally, a large plume of smoke could be seen overhead and in the surrounding blocks from the blast.

The blast left 17 people injured, ten are LAPD officers, one Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives agent, and the six others are civilians. According to the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD), the worst injuries were sustained by a 60-year-old man, an 85-year-old woman, and a 51-year-old woman. With a school just blocks away, it is extremely fortunate that more people and specifically children were not injured.

The result of this operation is inexplicable and we must ensure that a similar result never happen again.

I MOVE that the LAPD, with the assistance of the LAFD, expedite a report on the failed operation, including what caused the explosion, and how to better protect the public and ensure a similar event never happens in the City of Los Angeles in the future.

I FURTHER MOVE that the City Attorney, with assistance of the LAPD, work with the affected individuals of the blast and ensure that they are properly compensated for damages to any of their property as well as any injuries they incurred.

**SUR CENTRO LOS ANGELES-** En Julio, 4, 2021 el Ayuntamiento Vecinal Central Alameda voto Unánimemente para **DEMANDAR: \$ 900,110,000** en alivio financiero inmediato, remedios y servicios para sobrevivientes del Departamento de Policía de Los Ángeles Comportamiento imprudente, peligroso e ilegal explosión de fuegos artificiales orquestado el 30 de junio de 2021 en el Sur Centro de Los Ángeles

**CONSIDERANDO** que, el miércoles 30 de junio, el Departamento de Policía de Los Ángeles orquestó, planeó y llevó a cabo una explosión de fuegos artificiales ilegales utilizando equipo militarizado en el centro sur de Los Ángeles que resultó en traumas psicológicos y lesiones que amenazaron la vida y cambiaron la vida de miles de residentes.

**CONSIDERANDO** que, las familias directamente afectadas por la explosión viven actualmente en condiciones que amenazan la vida, ya que los refugios temporales y los hoteles no son apropiados para la recuperación y curación total de los seres humanos desplazados por una explosión imprudente orquestada,

**CONSIDERANDO** que, la planificación y ejecución de la explosión no tuvo en cuenta el daño potencial a la vida, la tierra, la naturaleza, los animales y la propiedad en un área compuesta por comunidades mayoritariamente de bajos ingresos, Indígenas, Mexicanos, de habla

hispana únicamente, Negros y Africanos. con acceso limitado a representación legal o acceso a atención médica

**CONSIDERANDO** que, el propósito del Departamento de Policía de Los Ángeles en los Documentos de Presupuesto Abierto de la Ciudad es "proteger a las personas y la propiedad y para la preservación de la paz de la comunidad",

**CONSIDERANDO** que, el Departamento de Policía de Los Ángeles no cumplió con su propósito de brindar servicios bajo los Estatutos de la Ciudad al usar de manera irresponsable e ilegal equipo de destrucción masiva en un vecindario residencial,

**CONSIDERANDO** que, de conformidad con el Estatuto de la Ciudad, los Consejos Vecinales son responsables de garantizar que el Gobierno de la Ciudad siga respondiendo a las necesidades locales (Estatuto § 900);

**CONSIDERANDO** que, de conformidad con el Estatuto de la Ciudad, los Consejos Vecinales son miembros electos de la comunidad que se ofrecen como voluntarios y supervisan la prestación de los Servicios de la Ciudad (Estatuto § 910)

**AHORA, POR LO TANTO, SE RESUELVE**, el Concejo Vecinal de Alameda Central solicita al Concejo Municipal de Los Ángeles desmilitarizar inmediatamente al LAPD reasignando y redirigiendo el 50% del presupuesto del Departamento de Policía de Los Ángeles para crear protección, curación y alivio financiero para personas, propiedades, animales, tierra y naturaleza y devolver la paz a la comunidad,

**AHORA, POR LO TANTO, SE RESUELVE**, el Concejo Municipal de Los Ángeles reasignará \$ 900,110,000 del presupuesto de más de \$ 1.85 mil millones del Departamento de Policía de Los Ángeles en pagos directos para las comunidades afectadas como se describe:

**\$ 400,000,000 en pagos directos por daños a la vida**, la propiedad y el trauma psicológico de las víctimas y sobrevivientes del bombardeo de LAPD del 30 de junio en el centro sur de Los Ángeles.

**\$ 110,000 se redirigen inmediatamente al Concejo Vecinal de Central Alameda** y otros Consejos Vecinales que apoyan y brindan representación y becas para propósitos de alivios financiero para las comunidades afectadas por las emergencias de salud y explosiones actuales.

**\$ 300,000,000 para reconstruir infraestructura sostenible** para brindar servicios de la ciudad en áreas de salud, apoyo psicológico y acceso a espacios verdes y parques en áreas destinadas a servicios para experiencias traumáticas.

**\$200,000,000 reasignados inmediatamente a Parques y Recreación** de la Ciudad encargados de albergar a las víctimas del bombardeo y otras actividades de curación comunitaria

**South Central Los Angeles-** On July 4th the Central Alameda Neighborhood Council held an Emergency Meeting where the board unanimously approved **COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT DEMAND: \$900,110,000 immediate Request for Financial Relief**, Remedies, and Services for Survivors of Los Angeles Police Department reckless, dangerous, and illegal behavior in the June 30, 2021 orchestrated Explosions of Fireworks in South Central, Los Angeles

**WHEREAS**, on Wednesday, June 30 the Los Angeles Police Department orchestrated, planned, and carried out an explosion of illegal fireworks using militarized equipment in South Central Los Angeles that resulted in life threatening and life changing psychological trauma and injuries to thousands of residents

**WHEREAS** families directly impacted by the explosion are currently living under life threatening conditions as temporary shelters and hotels are not appropriate for the full recovery and healing of human beings displaced by an orchestrated reckless explosion,

**WHEREAS**, the planning and execution of the explosion failed to take in consideration potential harm to life, land, nature, animals, and property in an area composed of majority low-income, indigenous, Mexican, Spanish-speaking only, Black and African communities with limited access to legal representation or access to health care

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the Los Angeles Police Department in the [City's Open Budget Documents](#) is, "protecting persons and property and for the preservation of the peace of the community",

**WHEREAS**, the Los Angeles Police Department failed to serve its purpose to deliver services under City Charter by irresponsibly and illegally using equipment of mass destruction in a residential neighborhood,

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City's Charter, Neighborhood Councils are responsible with ensuring City Government remains responsive to local needs (Charter § 900);

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City's Charter, Neighborhood Councils are elected members of the community who volunteer and monitor the delivery of City Services (Charter § 910)

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED**, the Central Alameda Neighborhood Council request the Los Angeles City Council immediately demilitarize LAPD by reallocating and redirecting %50 of Los Angeles Police Department budget to create protection, healing, and financial relief for persons, property, animals, land and nature and to bring back peace to the community,

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED**, the Los Angeles City Council reallocate \$900,110,000 from the over \$1.85 Billion Los Angeles Police Department budget into direct payments for affected communities as described:

**\$110,000 immediately redirected to Central Alameda Neighborhood Council and other Neighborhood Councils directly supporting** and providing representation and Neighborhood Purpose Grants for communities affected by current health and explosion emergencies.

**\$400,000,000 in direct payments** for damages to life, property and psychological trauma to the Victims and Survivors of the June 30, LAPD Bombing of South Central Los Angeles.

**\$300,000,000 to rebuild sustainable infrastructure** to provide city services in areas of health, psychological support, and access to green nature spaces and parks in areas targeting services for traumatic experiences.

**\$200,000,000 immediately reallocated to City Parks** and Recreation tasked with housing victims of Bombing and other community community healing activities

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
